Parking permits on sale, changes to payroll deduction dates

Faculty and staff parking permits for the 2021-22 academic year are on sale now. <u>Get yours here</u>

The parking permit payroll deduction has been updated this year. Permits will be deducted in 15 equal payments between Sept. 16 and April 16. Permit deductions will no longer occur in the summer months. For 2021-22 permits, the deductions will be \$25 per pay period.

Flexible Work Arrangement form site launches

Any employee completing a flexible work arrangement should do so in the new site. The site allows for creating, amending, renewing, or expiring such an arrangement. All flexible work arrangements will continue to be approved by an immediate supervisor and head of department.
